
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Principal's News











Last Friday, the Year 10 students led a very moving Remembrance Day service where we paid tribute to our servicemen and women who sacrificed their lives for us to live in a free nation. Our students actively participated in many ways. The Year F/I class placed a poppy on a memorial board to remember each local soldier who lost their life in conflict. The Year 2/3 students reflected on the significance of Remembrance Day and the Year 5/6 class shared with us their knowledge gained through researching the many symbols of war. The Year 7/8 class read out their poems that had been written in their English class. The Year 9 students attended to the flag raising and reading the Ode and 'On Flander's Fields'. Special thanks to the Year 7/8 Community Connection class who added many special touches to the service, such as poppies, ANZAC biscuits and paintings. All students were incredibly respectful and carried out their role with pride. Well done and thank you to everyone involved.

BYOD Program

In 2024 the College will continue with the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) for Year 7-10 students. If parents are purchasing a device we ask that you please check our BYOD specifications requirements below so the device is able to connect to our network and be serviced by our technician.

Whilst we encourage parents to purchase a device for their Year 7-10 students, we will once again have a limited supply of devices that students may borrow for classroom use only. These devices will not be allowed to be taken home. The school will continue to provide iPads or netbooks for Year F-6 students. These school owned devices will not be allowed to be taken home.

To help students and parents with purchasing their BYOD the school suggest some specification for notebooks (allowing parents to shop about, especially during 'sales time'.)

Suggested Notebook Specification:

- · Operating System: Windows 10 or newer
- · CPU: Intel i3, equivalent or better
- · RAM/Memory: 8GB or more
- · Storage: I28GB SSD (Solid State Drive) or larger.
- · Screen Size: II inches or larger
- · Suggested warranty of 2 years or more
- · A Laptop Bag is essential
- · Battery life of 8hrs or more
- \cdot AntiVirus software is required before computers are allowed on the school's wireless network
