## Newton's First Law: Inertia

An object at rest remains at rest, and an object in motion remains in motion at constant speed and in a straight line unless acted on by an unbalanced force.

## Newton's Second Law: Force

The acceleration of an object depends on the mass of the object and the amount of force applied.
Newton's Third Law: Action \& Reaction
Whenever one object exerts a force on a second object, the second object exerts an equal and opposite force on the first.

They investigated the effect of drag on runners and the effect of weight on acceleration of a ball.

Understanding and testing drag is important in different sports to give athletes the edge. Scientists are constantly developing material that help athletes deal better with drag forces.

## HANDSON LEARNING

For Hands on Learning this week, students finished off their work for the Neighbourhood House. We filled the last garden bed, moved the excess soil and spread the gravel around the car park. We also mowed the lawn at the Pre school and cooked lunch for everyone.



We have been privileged to have access to 3D printers provided by Bendigo Tech School which has allowed secondary students to use a 3D modelling program to design parts for their respective projects.

Year 7 and 8 students have designed mousetrap powered cars or trebuchets or catapults as a part of their exploration of simple machines. The cars were raced as a part of the biannual mouse trap car competition. The record of 12.66 m held by Psalm Caburnay remains. When undertaking these design projects, they needed to apply the STEM principles of testing and then refining their design.

In a catapult, the energy is stored via elasticity and in trebuchets it is stored by working against the ever pervasive force of gravity.
